ANTI-BRIBERY AND CORRUPTION POLICY

- Pharmanza Herbal Pvt. Ltd. Ltd. business. Pharmanza Herbal Pvt. Ltd. values integrity and transparency and has zero tolerance for corrupt activities of any kind, whether committed by Pharmanza Herbal Pvt. Ltd. employees, officers, or third-parties acting for or on behalf of the Pharmanza Herbal Pvt. Ltd.
- Corrupt Payments Pharmanza Herbal Pvt. Ltd. employees and any third party acting for or on behalf of Pharmanza Herbal Pvt. Ltd., shall not, directly or indirectly, promise, authorize, ratify or offer to make or make any "payments" of "anything of value" to any individual including a "government Official" for the improper purpose of influencing or inducing or as a reward for any act, omission or decision to secure an improper advantage or to improperly assist the company in obtaining or retaining business.
- Government Officials Although Pharmanza Herbal Pvt. Ltd.'s policy prohibits
 payments by Pharmanza Herbal Pvt. Ltd. or third parties acting for or on its
 behalf to any individual, private or public, as a "quid pro quo" for business, due
 to the existence of specific anticorruption laws in the countries where we
 operate, this policy is particularly applicable to "payments" of "anything of
 value", or at the request of, "government officials".
- Facilitating Payments for the avoidance of doubt, facilitating payments (otherwise known as "greasing payments" and defined as payments to an individual to secure or expedite the performance of a routine government action by government officials) are no exception to the general rule and therefore prohibited.
